Grant funding is provided for the Heritage Capital Projects Fund pursuant to RCW 27.34.330. These funds provide up to one third of the cost of local capital projects undertaken by non-profit organizations, tribes and various local governments. Projects that provide for the preservation and interpretation of the heritage of the state are submitted by applicants, reviewed and ranked by an advisory panel and submitted for inclusion in the agency's state capital budget.
