Prepare catalogs, posters, and information packets concerning collections and exhibitions; correspond with public regarding collections, exhibitions, facilities, etc.; answering technical inquiries;

Conduct tours of laboratory or museum; deliver lectures concerning the content and purpose of collections and exhibitions;

Organize and direct the maintenance of records and files concerning collections; develop and maintain collection catalog system; oversee the inventory of collections, equipment, and materials in facility;
