BARBER

Abolished Effective June 1, 2005

<u>Definition</u>: Manages an institution barber shop and performs skilled barbering work.

Typical Work

Cuts hair and shaves patients, students, or inmates of an institution; performs barbering work for bed patients;

Sharpens, sterilizes, and maintains barber tools and equipment;

Observes scalp and skin conditions; reports unhealthy conditions and gives scalp treatments;

Requisitions, safeguards, and stores supplies and equipment;

Cleans and maintains barber shop and its furnishings;

Keeps records; makes reports;

Performs other work as required.

Knowledge and Abilities

Knowledge of: methods, supplies, tools, equipment, and aseptic practices of barber trade, record keeping.

Ability to: perform volume general barber work on students and ambulatory or bed patients.

Minimum Qualifications

A valid license to practice barbering in Washington State.

An applicant with a valid permit to practice barbering in the State of Washington may be hired in an in-training status until eligible to obtain a license.

OR

A valid Washington State cosmetologist license is required.
